Emerging LGBTQ Artists Find Hope Amid a Grim Political Landscape

The Queer Art Mentorship (QAM) annual exhibition, Here & Not Yet, comes at a critical moment for the LGBTQ community.

This year's Queer Art Mentorship (QAM) annual exhibition, entitled Here & Not Yet, comes at a critical moment for the LGBTQ community. Just days before the opening at the historic Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, & Transgender Community Center in New York (The Center), the Trump administration announced its plan to narrowly define gender as a biological, immutable condition determined by genitalia at birth. If this effort succeeds, it would essentially define trans- and non-binary-identifying people out of existence.

LGBTQ Tours Offer a New Way of Looking at an Old Museum

At the Victoria & Albert Museum, LGBTQ tours offer a queer history of the museum's collections.

A visitor to London's Victoria & Albert Museum would find it hard to miss the six-and-a-half-foot-tall statue of Samson slaying a Philistine that stands near the museum's main entrance. With its tangle of frenzied bodies, the marble sculpture is a testament to sixteenth-century Flemish sculptor Giambologna's sense of drama and eye for detail.

Taking place on the last Saturday of each month, the tours are free to all and aim to uncover the queer histories of the objects in the museum's collection. In addition to shining a spotlight on queer artists — or, in the case of the Giambologna sculpture, queer owners — the tours also examine pieces with

more easily recognizable connections to LGBTQ history.
