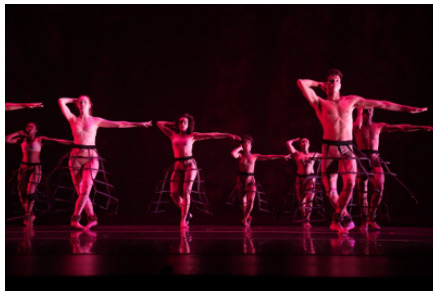
Santa Barbara Pacific Pride Festival Saturday, August 27
