Remembering Andrew Campbell (1952-2023)



A celebration of the life of Andrew Campbell will be held on January 20, 2024 at the All Saints Episcopal Church, in Beverly Hills at 11am.

Longtime city staffer Andrew Campbell passed away on December 19, with family at his side. Campbell worked at the City of West Hollywood from 2007 to 2020 before his retirement.

Campbell passionately served as the City of West Hollywood's Arts Manager. Under his leadership, the City of West Hollywood was recognized with many prestigious awards. Among those were two in 2018, one award from the National Endowment for the Arts Art Works Program, and the other award from the Americans for the Arts Public Art Network Year in Review program. Campbell retired from City Hall shortly thereafter.

Mayoral candidate Lurie banks on SF ties



For Daniel Lurie, a major talking point for why he is seeking to become San Francisco's next mayor is his deep connections to the city. His campaign website bio is even titled "A San Francisco Story," which it notes is "firmly rooted in" the city where he grew up.

A poll of 628 likely voters done in late October found 42% had never heard of Lurie, while another 26% said they didn't know enough about him to rate him as favorable or unfavorable. He was rated favorable by 18% of the respondents to the poll conducted by FM3 Research.

"We need to get back to basics and it starts with leadership," Lurie told the B.A.R. "At this time I really believe it needs to be leadership from the outside."

Anyone can report anonymously and your report will not be shared with law enforcement without your consent unless required by law.

We are creating a Storytellers Boot Camp workshop, where participants work with creative team members assisting them in scripting, shooting, editing, and publishing their videos — all in one day. The first Boot Camp workshop is scheduled for February 24 and will be in partnership with the City of Glendale, California and the Glendale Central Library.
